ACCESSIBLE SECLUSION

GEORGIAN BAY, ONTARIO

Canada's vast and gorgeous Georgian Bay offers the best of both worlds: proximity to big civilization (it's under 100 miles from Toronto) meshed with the complete tranquility and seclusion of bayside island life. Georgian Bay features more than 1,200 miles of majestic coastline and some 30,000 islands, which together form the largest freshwater archipelago on the planet.

These four exclusive Ontario island properties cover a variety of Georgian Bay locales and can accommodate varying numbers of guests, but they share several terrific traits. All offer utter privacy, magnificent views, easy access to a world of outdoor adventure options, and striking structures in complete turnkey condition.

Located in the sparkling waters of Georgian Bay's south channel is Maud Island. The 18 acre property has ample room for the active family to hike, play tennis and enjoy sandy beaches. Stunning vistas can be enjoyed throughout the island's terrain, which is comprised of the west leaning pines and beautiful granite rock formations that are the trademark of Georgian Bay. The island was made with the active host or large family in mind and includes a main lodge, "hideaway" cottage, a caretaker's cottage, 2 guest cottages, a boathouse along with a 2 room children's playhouse.

The main lodge was constructed in 1948 and features whole log construction with high beam ceilings and pine flooring throughout. A







Just to the south of nearby O'Donnell Point Nature Reserve lies the spectacular trio known as the Tryon Islands, or simply as Islands 347, 349, and 217. These isles lie at the mouth of Freeman Bay and feature the dramatic rocky surfaces, low crawling foliage, and windswept trees that are characteristic of this stunning area of Georgian Bay.


The outermost of the group is the 2.4-acre Island 347, which is home to two state-of-the-art cottages that total 1,040 square feet and are literally woven into the landscape around a cluster of trees at the island's center. Designed by architect Bill Dewson and built by experienced local contractor White Construction, the Douglas fir cottages and their connecting decks were created to withstand the sometimes harsh extremes of the Bay's climate.

The main cottage features a multitude of striking elements, including its wood burning fireplace crafted of Owen Sound limestone, solar-

powered halogen light fixtures, a limestone-floored master bath with clear cedar walls, stainless steel kitchen cabinetry, and limestone kitchen counters. Propane powers both the refrigerator and range, and a propane gas line supplies the barbecue on the cedar deck. The island's third structure is a one-room waterside sleeping cottage built on concrete block piers.

Connected to Island 347 by a natural land bridge is 3-acre Island 349, currently vacant but a logical location for additional structures, such as a guest cottage. Both 347 and 349 have granite projections that carve out natural protected harbors. The island cluster's third member, the 1-acre unbuildable Island 217, lies just to the west.

Readily accessible from either of the marinas on Twelve Mile Bay Road, the striking Tryon Islands are being offered at the reduced price of CAD \$1,950,000.





Providing the added layer of privacy and spectacular unobstructed views that only an outer island can, Kishkadena Island is considered one of the finest of its class in Georgian Bay.

Located in the lovely Pointe au Baril community in the Parry Sound District, Kishkadena is just minutes from the Ojibway Club - the area's social and recreational hub, and one of the few remaining turn-of-thecentury lodges in the region. Sited on 3.98 acres, the property's glorious 5,000-square-foot beach house was designed by Stark Ireland Architects and boasts a master suite with walk-in closet and adjoining office all featuring custom millwork, three additional en suite bedrooms upstairs (two with balconies), an openconcept living/dining room with cathedral ceilings, a custom kitchen with Wolf appliances and Sub Zero refrigerator, a pantry with second dishwasher, and an indoor/outdoor stone fireplace.

Its expansive deck has a custom built-in stone barbeque, a wet bar, and a hot tub, and leads to a beach and a custom stone fire pit. The home's infrastructure includes water purification and septic systems, a transformer, lightning protection, a utility building with 600 amps and 50 kilowatt generator back up, a fire pump, two air conditioning systems, wifi, and under floor heating in nearly every room.

A coveted outer island gem with a beautiful home overlooking the bay, Kishkadena is offered at USD \$4,295,000.
